
I am enormously grateful for the generosity of the people of our Archdiocese. I look forward to seeing the continued growth and vibrancy of our Catholic schools!

Wave III parish perseveres, surpasses goal after two Commitment Weekends



As the new parish administrator at St. Joseph Parish in Round Lake, Father Julio Jimenez felt more comfortable engaging the whole parish, rather than a few families, in To Teach Who Christ Is.

"Everyone is responsible for the parish, not just 15 or 20 families," he says. "I wanted everyone to participate."

Father Jimenez also focused heavily on the local needs that To Teach Who Christ Is would fund. For four consecutive weekends at Mass, he played a different video on each of the parish's four needs: replacing the church roof and heating system, resurfacing the parking lot, improving education technology at the school, and upgrading the church lighting to be energy efficient, controllable and softer.

Father Jimenez even managed to work the campaign theme into these facility projects by emphasizing his plea on evangelization. "Taking care of these issues right now will ensure that we can continue the mission of To Teach Who Christ Is," he told parishioners. "Without a roof, we wouldn't be here to continue to teach Christ, to form us."

The parish held two Commitment Weekends, which brought in \$800,000 in gifts. Currently, St. Joseph has raised more than \$1.04 million, or 181 percent of its \$575,227 goal, and Father says he continues to receive pledges.

"It was a lot of work, but it paid off," he says. "It was successful. People understand that what we want to do at the parish is simply to teach who Christ is."

VOLUNTEER PROFILE | Susan Parker



'I hear people complain all the time, and I'm a doer. Complaining doesn't get the job done. I'd rather use the talents God has given me to be part of the solution.' Susan Parker was considering taking a sabbatical from the many ministries she is active in at Divine Infant Jesus Parish when her pastor, Father Michael Wanda, asked her to consider co-chairing the parish's *To Teach Who Christ Is* campaign.

She quickly realized how much the Westchester parish would benefit from the campaign, so she put her plans for a year off temporarily on hold. "Our parish has so many needs," she says. "This, to me, is a great opportunity to make people aware that the parish needs things fixed."

Divine Infant Jesus will receive \$441,000 when it meets its campaign goal, and plans to use the majority of these funds for facility needs in the church, including replacing the sound system, repairing the leaky roof, and bringing the building up to code. In addition, 25 percent of the funds will be directed to the Father Charles Langan Scholarship Fund.

The sound system is especially important to Susan, as she has personally witnessed senior parishioners unable to understand the homily and, therefore, its message.

Father Wanda asked Susan to share her thoughts on the campaign with her fellow parishioners during Mass. She told them that she prayed "hard and long" before making her five-year pledge to their spiritual home.

"After discerning, I realized it was Christ who inspired people before us to build and care for this parish," she says. "Now its up to the Christ in us to maintain the work for those who will come after us to continue *to teach who Christ is*."

Susan became an active parishioner at Divine Infant eight years ago after participating in the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. Since then, she has served as a lector, a catechist and a choir member, and was on the Parish Pastoral Council and School Advisory Board.

"I hear people complain all the time, and I'm a doer," she says. "Complaining doesn't get the job done. I'd rather use the talents God has given me to be part of the solution."

Campaign funds create new parish center

Campaign Update: Generosity continues across Archdiocese



TO TEACH Who christ is

A Campaign for Parishes, Catholic Education and Faith Formation Gifts to the *To Teach Who Christ Is* campaign now total nearly \$215 million, thanks to more than 33,000 generous gifts.

Archbishop Blase Cupich has conducted more than 50 individual meetings and raised more than \$26 million in gifts and pledges. The \$114.3 million in major gift and bequest commitments from individuals and foundations, raised personally by Cardinal Francis George, OMI, and Archbishop Cupich, will primarily benefit Catholic school scholarships and religious education programs.

Ten Wave IV parishes have now surpassed goal. The 56 parishes in the current wave have raised \$21.8 million, or 72 percent of their collective goal. These parishes have started conducting Commitment Weekends.

Wave III parishes have now raised more than \$25 million, or 127 percent of the wave's collective goal. All parishes have now conducted their Commitment Weekends.

More than 70 parishes will participate in Wave V, which begins after the New Year. Four Campaign Executive Committee orientations, to accommodate the wave's more than 2,000 families, will be held in January.
