Current wave of *To Teach Who Christ Is* set to make history for the Catholic Church

The 68 parishes participating in Wave V of *To Teach Who Christ Is* are well on their way to making history. When the current wave meets goal, it will be the first single wave in any Archdiocesan capital campaign to raise more than \$40 million.

"Most important is the impact this generosity will have in those parishes, in regards to meeting their local needs, and for the shared ministries of the Archdiocese the campaign will benefit," says Peter de Keratry, campaign manager. "That is what is truly impressive."

Gifts from nearly 6,000 families have brought Wave V parishes to 70 percent of their collective goal of \$41.325 million. Nineteen parishes in Wave V have met or

exceeded their individual goals. Overall, the *To Teach Who Christ Is* campaign is closing in on \$300 million of its \$350 million goal.

Chicago's St. Florian Parish is currently at 128 percent of its goal, and the pastor, Father Robert Marchwiany, says the campaign has been a great tool for him to personally meet with his parishioners and explain the needs of the parish. "The parishioners enjoyed being included in the process," he says. "They felt recognized. The parish is their very important center of faith."

Father Marchwiany points out that *To Teach Who Christ Is* has also helped parishioners feel calmer about the future of the parish, which was founded 110 years ago to serve the growing needs of the Polish community. St. Florian will use campaign funds to replace its nearly 100-year-old church boiler.

Tammy Vesolowski, chair of the Campaign Executive Committee at St. Andrew the Apostle Parish in Calumet City, credits her parish's success to the dedication of volunteers and leadership of the pastor, Father Jacek Dada. The parish is now at 110 percent of goal, and will use campaign funds to improve its school building and gymnasium, which often hosts parish activities and events, as well as refresh the adjacent parking lot.

"I feel parishioners were motivated to give because St. Andrew's is our home," she says. "We needed this campaign. Not just our parish, but the entire Archdiocese."

Forty percent of what parishes raise up to their goals is being directed to shared ministries of the Archdiocese of Chicago, such as Catholic education and faith formation.

"To Teach Who Christ Is is important to me because the continued health of the Catholic Church depends, in my mind, on the education of our children in our faith," says Lois Heintz, a CEC member at St. Andrew. "I think enough of our parishioners believe this also, and this made it easier to ask for their pledges."

New Chief Development Officer joins Archdiocese of Chicago



a bachelor's degree in political science, he was awarded a Rotary Foundation Ambassadorial Scholarship to study at the University of Stockholm, where he did a year of graduate research on Sweden's social welfare system. He received his master's degree in history education from Florida State University.

After graduate school, he served as the legislative aide to Florida State Senator Tom McPherson and later as the legislative aide to the Majority Leader of the Florida House of Representatives, Rep. Anne Mackenzie.

No donor too young, no gift too small

A 9-year-old parishioner at St. James on Wabash Avenue emptied her piggy bank to support *To Teach Who Christ Is.* The \$2.56 gift, as well as the more than \$100,000 pledged during Commitment Weekend, helped the Chicago parish reach 163 percent of its \$260,000 goal. Campaign funds will allow St. James to replace the windows and roof in its parish hall, where the congregation worships, and overhaul the heating system.


