Scholarship Feature: The Phoenix Scholarship

Through campaign funding and other programming, the Archdiocese of Chicago is able to offer need-based scholarships to families, making Catholic education affordable and accessible to those who value sending their child and/or children to Catholic school.

Strengthening Catholic education continues to be a key element of the *To Teach Who Christ Is* campaign, with up to \$150 million in campaign funds directed to the Catholic Education Scholarship Trust. The Phoenix Scholarship ensures access to Catholic education for families throughout Cook and Lake counties and is eligible to families with children in any school listed in the Official Catholic Directory for the Archdiocese of Chicago who demonstrate financial need and meet certain other criteria established by the Trust Board. Initially, the Trust Board elected to prioritize scholarships for families and schools with the greatest need. As the Trust endowment has grown, the Trust Board has expanded to serve as many students as possible while protecting

the long-term viability of the endowment.

To apply, families must complete and submit the standard FACTS financial aid application from their schools. Verified applications are then sent to the Office of Catholic Schools for administrative processing. The Office of Catholic Schools sends applicants an acknowledgment of its receipt of the application. The Trust Board has created a Scholarship Delegation Committee to review and approve scholarship awards on behalf of the Trust Board. Once a scholarship award decision has been made, applicants will receive a letter from the Office of Catholic Schools notifying them of the award decision and the amount of the scholarship, Awards are made on a rolling basis.

Scholarships may cover up to 50 percent of a student's tuition with the balance paid by the parents or guardians of the student. The scholarship may be renewable annually based on a continued demonstration of need and meeting certain other criteria. Contributions towards this fund are even more important during this time, as unemployment numbers related to COVID-19 will result in even more demand for scholarships and assistance with tuition.
