Dear Friends,

The *To Teach Who Christ Is* campaign is critical to the mission of the Church, and supporting parishes, Catholic education and faith formation aligns with the priorities of our archbishop, Cardinal Francis George. Success in the campaign will ensure a strong future for the next generation of Chicagoland Catholics.

The critical nature of the campaign has led us to make some significant changes. In listening to pastors and lay leaders who have already conducted the campaign in their parishes, we decided to review our campaign plan and its implementation. Based on this feedback, we have altered the course of the campaign.

The most significant changes include both the timeline of the campaign's implementation in parishes and our fundraising consultants. The new timeline will slow the campaign down and allow some parishes to move their campaigns to 2016. A new fundraising consulting firm with offices in Chicago, CCS Fundraising, has been retained to provide more handson parish-based support. What's more, additional waves have been added with fewer parishes in each wave.

We are grateful to all those who have helped us to raise more than \$120 million toward our \$350 million goal. Your generosity and prayers will ensure we can continue *To Teach Who Christ Is*.

Congregations and prayer houses praying for *To Teach Who Christ Is* campaign



Early each morning, when the Benedictine Sisters of Chicago gather in their chapel for daily Mass, they pray for intentions near and far. Included in their prayers are parishes across the Archdiocese raising funds for the *To Teach Who Christ Is* campaign.

The campaign has significant meaning to the 38 sisters because of its focus on Catholic education and faith formation, said Sister Patricia Crowley, prioress.

"Most of the sisters taught all of their lives," she said, as the order operated and served in grammar schools and academies in both Illinois and Colorado. "Many also worked in parish ministry."

Prayer is an important element of the *To Teach Who Christ Is* campaign. There is a formal prayer specifically for the campaign, which parishes are encouraged to

incorporate into their prayer routines, such as at Masses and meetings, and to publish in bulletins and on their websites. In addition, parishes are encouraged to establish campaign prayer committees and invite prayer requests from parishioners and donors.

"The Church that prays together is a stronger Church," explained Msgr. Richard Hynes, director of the Department of Parish Life and Formation and chair of the campaign's committee on prayer activities.

CASE ELEMENT: Facility life safety

The Catholic churches of the Archdiocese of Chicago are more than places of worship to the 2.2 million Catholics who live within its boundaries. Their steeples, spires and stained glass are a constant reminder of Christ among us. In total, more than 2,800 individual structures — sacred spaces as well as parish activity buildings, convents, rectories and schools — can be found in Cook and Lake counties.

Many of these sacred spaces are more than 100 years old and time has wrought havoc on this plethora of diverse structures. Many buildings have critical needs and issues beyond what some parishes in distressed communities are able to address given their financial circumstances.

The Archdiocesan Facilities and Construction Department monitors life safety issues in parishes throughout the Archdiocese. Addressing these issues in a timely manner is critical, as they affect the safety of the building, and therefore of its parishioners.

A full \$30 million of the funds raised for the *To Teach Who Christ Is* campaign will be designated for urgently needed repairs in economically distressed parishes. This reserve fund, to be distributed over the next 10 years, will be used to meet issues as they arise.
