Parish and school unite to invest in their future

The St. Benedict community was "ready to invest for the future," says Father Jason Malave, pastor, which led the Chicago parish to exceed its independent campaign goal of \$4.5 million.

The parish launched *Forward in Our Faith* after two years of planning, through both the Parish Transformation Initiative and a master plan process. Besides *To Teach Who Christ Is*, the capital campaign will support maintenance and upgrades to the church and other facilities to preserve the historic campus; a two-story addition to the school, resulting in a new campus learning center and seven additional classrooms; and an educational endowment for its sharing parish, Our Lady of the Snows in Chicago.

Parishes seeking to raise extraordinary funds for parish projects — or more than three times the parish offertory — have the option of conducting an Independent Parish Campaign. *To Teach Who Christ Is* becomes a component of these independent campaigns, with parishes contributing the same percentage of their Archdiocesan-set goal for shared ministries.

Parishes are required to retain, but are able to choose, fundraising counsel to conduct a feasibility study to ensure the parish is capable of meeting an ambitious target. For standard or enhanced *To Teach Who Christ Is* campaigns, the Archdiocese of Chicago provides fundraising counsel at no cost to parishes. With Independent campaigns, parishes are required to select from a list of pre-approved professional fundraising counsel.

St. Benedict's parish campaign director lived and worked at the parish each day to manage the daily operations of the campaign and support campaign and volunteer leaders during the five-month campaign. Father Malave says hundreds of generous families have



pledged more than \$4.5 million, or nearly 600 percent of annual parish collections, to *Forward in Our Faith*. Elated by this response, the campaign team was inspired to set a challenge goal of \$6.2 million.

St. Benedict Preparatory School is the only coed preschool through twelfth grade parish school in the city, and serves a thousand students. The parish has 2,800 families. Both were founded in 1902 in the North Center neighborhood.

Rachel Gemo, head of the parish school, explains that education is one of St. Benedict's five commissions. "When people see we're investing back in the school, it creates energy and excitement," she says. "They're proud of the school. People want this important ministry to continue for the long term. Funding shows that people are invested in making this happen."

Both St. Benedict Parish and School are integral parts of Aileen Blake and Tom Tansor's lives. Parishioners for eight years, they have three children enrolled in the parish school.

"We feel very blessed to be a part of such a vibrant, welcoming community and want to see the parish continue to thrive over the coming years," Aileen says. "We are passionate about the school as well. We believe in the mission of the school and want to help ensure that the school can continue to grow and deliver quality education to children at an affordable cost. We believe *Forward in Our Faith* is critical to ensuring that the school has the facilities and resources needed to fulfill its mission in the coming years."

The couple was "humbled and nervous" when Father Malave called and asked them to co-chair the campaign. But having already attended an information meeting where the details of the parish master plan and campaign were shared, they quickly agreed to help out.

Aileen and Tom expected their fellow parishioners would be willing to step up and make sacrifices, but they were frequently surprised by just how committed they were and the generosity they showed.

"Forward in Our Faith was a great way to connect the entire parish and school community behind a common purpose," Aileen notes. "We believe the campaign has strengthened our parish and school — even before the first phases of work take place."

Since fellow co-chairs Patty Flynn and Joe Daprile do not have children attending the parish school, and regularly attend 5 p.m. Mass on Saturdays, they were unsure of their prospect for success. Still, they feel strongly about the importance of Catholic education and about the need for improvements to the parish, so decided not to let their limited interactions with other parishioners deter them from accepting Father Malave's request to take on a leadership role.

"As we started to meet with families, Joe and I were amazed by the generosity of the individuals that we met," Patty says. "We quickly realized how blessed St. Ben's is to have such wonderful people as parishioners. As a great side benefit, Joe and I now know many more of St. Ben's families as a result of the campaign."

She also says success would not have been possible without proper planning, the support and partnership of parish and school leadership, the professional campaign director, and the efforts of the lay leadership of the Campaign Executive Committee. "These individuals had family, work and other commitments yet they spent hours and hours of their time on the campaign," Patty adds. "Put it all together and you have a very successful campaign."



CAMPAIGN UPDATE

Wave IV off to a terrific start

Father Mark Kalema and Campaign Executive Committee (CEC) members at Our Lady of Peace Parish have set a new record for the *To Teach Who Christ Is* campaign.

Not only was the Chicago parish the first in Wave IV to surpass goal, it did so during only the second week of reporting gifts. Our Lady of Peace is at 139 percent of its parish goal, with 25 gifts.

Wave III parishes continue to accept gifts. Oak Lawn's St. Germaine Parish met goal following its final Commitment Weekend, following a group of volunteers delivering testimonials at Masses for several weekends beforehand. St. Germaine is the 22nd parish over goal for the wave, which is now at 115 percent of its overall goal.

Wave V will take place next January to June. This month and next, the Wave V preparations director will meet with those parishes about preparing a roster for the creation of campaign materials, thinking about the case for support, and considering potential CEC members.


