South Holland parish approaches campaign 'prayerfully and spiritually'



St. Jude the Apostle Parish plans to start a youth ministry program with campaign funds.

St. Jude the Apostle Parish has been in desperate need of a new boiler system — and the funds to pay for it. Thanks to the *To Teach Who Christ Is* campaign, the South Holland parish will warm its church and much more.

Parishioners, who were concerned about raising the \$190,000 needed for the boiler, are now astonished at their *To Teach Who Christ Is* success. The parish is at 140 percent of its \$445,000 goal.

"We were all amazed," says Jeff Nowak, a member of the parish's Campaign Executive Committee. "We never thought we'd be able to raise the money for the boiler, let alone three times that."

Although he was hesitant about ask-

ing his fellow parishioners for gifts, Jeff decided to listen to the words of his pastor, Father Ignatius Anaele. "He told us, 'We're going to do this prayerfully and do this spiritually," he recalls. "That turned me around, got me thinking we could do it."

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Jeff credits the hard work of all committee members, along with the guidance of the parish campaign director and the generosity of parishioners, for the parish's success. St. Jude the Apostle's share of *To Teach Who Christ Is* funds is more than \$443,000 in gifts and pledges. Besides the new boiler system, the parish plans to fix the parking lots and hire a youth minister.

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The parish had a youth minister until the changing neighborhood resulted in an aging parish population, says Deacon Tim Springer, who is serving as a campaign co-chair. When Father Anaele became pastor nearly eight years ago, he brought with him an influx of new, younger families reflecting his Nigerian heritage. Soon, young children were serving as altar servers, singing in the choir and actively participating in other parish activities.

"Now these children are in high school, and we want to give them the opportunity to grow in their faith and have a place to come together and socialize in a Catholic Christian atmosphere," Deacon Tim explains.

Not only will establishing a youth ministry program be a benefit for current parish families, he believes it will draw more people to St. Jude the Apostle. "Younger families like what's being offered here," he says. "It's an opportunity for our parish to grow as well."



Campaign funds revitalize church entrance

Chicago's St. Dorothy Church now has beautifully refurbished doors, thanks to funds raised during the parish's *To Teach Who Christ Is* campaign. St. Dorothy has raised 142 percent of its \$475,000 goal.

Although Matt and Mary Petrash have only been parishioners at St. Juliana for three years, they eagerly stepped up as co-chairs of the Chicago parish's *To Teach Who Christ Is* effort.

"We feel we are reaping the benefits of what others have sown for us in our vibrant parish and strong school here at St. Juliana," the couple says. "We also understand that we have a responsibility to do the same for the next generation."

St. Juliana has currently raised 90 percent of its \$1.13 million goal. The parish plans to use its share of campaign funds to replace the church sound system and remodel the front interior of the church, so the restrooms and doors are ADA compliant and the entire area is more inviting and welcoming. The parking lot will also be repaired, and the courtyard turned into a green space for the whole community to use. Lastly, an elevator will be added to the school building to make the hall and upper floors more accessible.

"We are lucky in that our buildings have been very well maintained," Mary says. "But this allows us to update areas to enhance our parish life as a community. We invite all to 'Come walk together the way of Christ,' and now our gathering spaces will be more welcoming."

Matt's family has been involved with St. Juliana for more than 60 years. In their short time there, the couple has become active as well. Their son, Joe, attends preschool at St. Juliana School. Matt is involved with the Men's Club, and is also a dedicated Knight of Columbus. Mary teaches religious education and is involved with the pastoral council, Missionary Spirit Team and bereavement ministry.

Still, as part of the campaign team, the Petrashes have enjoyed meeting more parishioners and learning about the long history of families in the parish. Plus, all volunteers have been "persistent, gracious and dedicated" and have "hope and faith in the campaign."

Personally, they see their involvement with *To Teach Who Christ Is* as an act of stewardship. "We can use our gifts of time, talent and treasure to lead others to do the same," Matt and Mary say. "The investment must be made. We are the Church." #
