At Most Blessed Trinity Parish, 'God has sent *To Teach Who Christ Is* to help us'



Most Blessed Trinity Parish will direct funds to Most Blessed Trinity Academy through the Generational Fund.

To Teach Who Christ Is "awakens that spirit in us of giving and doing God's will," says Elizabeth Morales-Pacheco, co-chair of the campaign at Most Blessed Trinity Parish in Waukegan.

"We were all just here, asleep, living our lives," she explains. "This whole project amazes me. I'm in a community of believers."

Most Blessed Trinity is already at 35 percent of its campaign goal, but has set an enhanced goal of \$2 million so \$1.486 million will remain at the parish for local needs. The parish was officially created in 2009 through a merger of Holy Family and Immaculate Conception in Waukegan and Queen of Peace in North Chicago, and parishioners continue to worship at the three sites.

"This campaign is important to me because it brings us together for a common purpose, that is, *to teach who Christ is*," says Father Jacque Beltran, pastor. "At the same time, this campaign enables us to commit to our mission of evangelization, which is the spread of the Good News of Salvation in Christ Jesus."

The parish will dedicate funds to facility projects at all three of its sites, such as increasing the narthex and lobby at Holy Family, replacing the roof at Immaculate Conception, and installing a fire safety system and repair the parking lot at Queen of Peace.

But the largest portion of Most Blessed Trinity's campaign funds will be invested in its Generational Fund. The parish relies on this fund for long-term needs, and plans to allocate money raised through *To Teach Who Christ Is* to religious education programs, Most Blessed Trinity Academy, community social service programs, and renovations required to the restrooms and boiler systems at all three churches.

Parishioners realize that their faith home has major facility issues and ministries in need of help as well, Elizabeth says, which has helped when Father Beltran and the Campaign Executive Committee have asked for leadership gifts. In addition, committee members pledged their own sacrificial gifts before asking other for their support, which was "encouraging and motivating to our parishioners."

"Our parish has been through a lot," she adds. "It was really hard to bring us to where we are now, and we don't want to lose that."

Although she grew up in the parish, Elizabeth became actively involved in 2008. She served the youth group, and as a lector and Eucharistic minister, and was involved with the parish radio show before becoming a member of the parish council two years ago. She and her husband (and campaign co-chair), Marlon Pacheco, met at Most Blessed Trinity, and he serves as the coordinator of religious education.

"We want to serve the Church, and we want to do it in a way where we're giving back," she says. "We've received so much from the Church."

Marlon has been at the parish since arriving in the United States from Honduras in 2003, and his involvement began through youth ministry. "It was a wonderful place to find real friends and family to walk with me in my daily life," he says, which is why he now wants to ensure future generations have the same access to the parish that he did.

"God has sent *To Teach Who Christ Is* to help us," Marlon says. "It has opened our eyes to what is possible if we come together."

Most Blessed Trinity has 750 students in its religious education program this year, and has had as many as 1,400 in the past. Marlon sees the campaign as crucial to ensuring that the parish's young people, from children to teenagers, stay involved and grow up to be active in the Church.

"If we don't invest in them, we will face some challenges other parishes are going through with empty pews," he says.

Not only is Most Blessed Trinity off to a strong start toward making its goal, the parish saw 32 new families at its volunteer orientation in February.

"I hope and pray that, through this campaign, we will learn more to appreciate the spirituality of stewardship — to cultivate the culture of giving — in light with our mission of evangelization," Father Beltran says. "I pray that we may realize through this campaign that 'God's generosity can never be outdone!" #

VOLUNTEER PROFILE | Donna Perisee McFarlane



As a member of both the building and grounds committee and Campaign Executive Committee at St. Ambrose in Chicago, Donna Perisee McFarlane is well aware of her parish's needs — and the importance of *To Teach Who Christ Is*.

"I see the aging and wear and tear issues quite frequently and understand the cost of repairs," Donna says. "I am endeared to my church home of 34 years and my parish community."

St. Ambrose has raised 82 percent of its \$250,000 campaign goal, and will retain \$150,000 if it meets goal. A new church sign has already been installed, and the parish also plans to use campaign funds to repair damaged portions of the church roof and ceiling as well as transform the school basement into a parish center.

"To Teach Who Christ Is will help make some of my dreams come true," Donna says. "We have a vested interest to attract new parishioners and to use the facilities we have onsite for parish events."

She sees value in the shared ministries the campaign is supporting across the Archdiocese of Chicago, too. "It is important that we continue to be able to provide a good, quality Catholic education to students, and also to reduce the burden of attempting to finance the entire repair cost of aging facilities," she says.

Donna has been inspiring her fellow parishioners to participate by letting them know that she has personally pledged her gift, and elaborating on how these projects will benefit the St. Ambrose community. She credits St. Ambrose's success to the love parishioners have for their Church and the parish, and their prayerful consideration of what success will bring.

"Our Heavenly Father always provides for each of us, in His own way," she says. #
