
To Teach Who Christ Is enters next phase

John T. Osterlund is the Chief Development Officer for the Archdiocese of Chicago. He offers insight into To Teach Who Christ Is' past, present and future.

This month, *To Teach Who Christ Is* concludes what is known as the "active phase" of a campaign. For four years, the faithful of the Archdiocese of Chicago have worked together — with much success!

The vision for our campaign began even before that, with the late Cardinal Francis George, OMI. In partnership with our campaign chairs, Jim and Molly Perry, and others, Cardinal George sought to provide support for not only shared ministries of the archdiocese but local parish communities as well. While he succeeded in raising more than \$80 million for the major gift effort, the early waves of the parish component struggled. But following the transition to CCS Fundraising in 2014, parishes, too, began experiencing success.

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From his first days in the archdiocese, Cardinal Blase Cupich was dedicated to continuing this effort that was so important to his predecessor. He has met weekly about the campaign, visited with hundreds of parish leaders, and established important partnerships that will extend far into the future. Cardinal Cupich also personally launched every wave with an orientation for volunteers and pastors.

As of today, more than 64,000 faithful have pledged \$391 million to the *To Teach Who Christ Is* campaign, and many Wave VI parishes are still conducting Commitment Weekends and collecting pledges. Truly, this has been an unparalleled experience in the history of the Church in Chicago and throughout the world.

We now embark on the "fulfillment phase" of the campaign. All who pledged their support for *To Teach Who Christ Is* were given the opportunity to pay their gifts over three to five years. Our goal now is to ensure these gifts are fulfilled, and those who gave them feel as supported during this process as when they were asked to contribute. formation and critical facility needs across Cook and Lake counties.

Of course, our story — our campaign does not end here, nor will it be concluded when every pledge is completed. It is a story that will be told for generations in the thou-

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Approximately \$115 million has already been received from pledges and one-time gifts. As pledges are paid, funds are immediately divided as the campaign promised: parishes receive 60 percent of funds they raised up to their goal (and 100 percent over goal), and the remaining 40 percent is directed to the shared ministries of the archdiocese. In other words, as you pay on your pledge, your parish receives its share of your gift and you support Catholic education, faith sands of local parish projects completed with gifts to the *To Teach Who Christ Is*, in the lives of children who are able to receive a quality, Catholic education because of scholarships from the Catholic Education Scholarship Trust or the Caritas Scholars Program, and in the faith of people of all ages who seek enrichment through bolstered religious education programs.

On behalf all those who will benefit for years to come because of your generosity, I thank you.

VOLUNTEER PROFILE | Deacon Mike and Mary Alice Benoit

Deacon Mike and Mary Alice Benoit were already active at St. John the Evangelist when their pastor, Father Gregg Gorczyca, asked if they would co-chair the Streamwood parish's *To Teach Who Christ Is* campaign.

Not only has the couple been parishioners for more than 30 years, Deacon Mike is assigned there as a member of the permanent diaconate and Mary Alice is the Director of Communications. Mary Alice says these roles made them both ideal for the Campaign Executive Committee (CEC), since they are each familiar with the many groups that comprise the diverse parish.

"That's what made the campaign successful," she says. "We tapped into every group of the parish. Our distinct cultures act as one parish, and it was vital to get every group involved."

St. John the Evangelist set an enhanced goal of \$2 million to address critical maintenance needs, and has now raised \$1.9 million. With its share of campaign funds, the parish plans to improve the HVAC system in the school and reconfigure and replace the upper church parking lot, as well as substantially reduce debt.

The leadership and excitement of Father Gorczyca and CEC members trickled through the parish, Mary Alice says. The community understood what parish leaders were trying to accomplish, and responded generously.

"We're a parish with a lot of heart and little means," Mary Alice adds. "But when you have a lot of parishioners who give from their heart, then you can raise \$1.9 million." #
