Caritas/Phoenix Scholarship Granted to Nearly 30 Students at Our Lady of Grace

Our Lady of Grace School was established in 1910 as a result of a request from families living near the parish who wanted to open a school for their children. Archbishop Quigley kindly granted their request and the school has been home to tens of thousands of children for over

a hundred years. Today, there are 197 students enrolled at Our Lady of Grace, with a staff of lay teachers led by Principal Sr. Rita Range, a Dominican Sister who has been with the school for 20 years. Sr. Range and staff dedicate their time to ensure each child's education incorporates personal, academic and spiritual development.

"We create the right environment for every child to become a confident learner, contribute to the community and develop good moral character," said Jennifer Moran, Director of Development and Marketing. "The education Our Lady of Grace students receive enriches every aspect of their lives, and, in turn, the life of our entire community. When we see our students become active in their communities and

To continue the school's legacy and empower their students to lead educated lives of faith, service and leadership, the school turned to the To Teach Who Christ Is campaign for funds for their Caritas/Phoenix Scholarship.

The Caritas/Phoenix Scholarship was created to provide Archdiocesan schools with the financial support needed to grow enrollment and continue providing an affordable Catholic education to all families, especially those dealing with grave financial stress.

Thanks to the *To Teach* Who Christ Is campaign, Our Lady of Grace currently has 29 students receiving the scholarship. Throughout the application process, families of these students expressed the importance of providing their children with a Catholic education, but believe it was out of their financial reach. Our Lady of Grace is proud to be able to offer tuition assistance to families, making it possible for every child seeking to build a stronger relationship with their loving God, the opportunity to do so.

"We often get calls, letters and visits from alumni telling us how their years at our school shaped who they've become," said Sr. Range. "We are truly grateful to all who support the To Teach Who Christ Is campaign. You've made it possible for the children of our community to receive a quality education that challenges them to achieve their full potential and become successful, confident individuals that shape the future of our society."
