St. Mother Teresa of Calcutta Continues to Focus on Faith Formation within Parish and Local Community



Parishioners of St. Mother Teresa of Calcutta have greatly benefited from the To Teach Who Christ Is campaign and the faith formation programs that were created because of funding.

St. Mother Teresa of Calcutta is a unified community located in the heart of Chicago's Chinatown and Bridgeport neighborhoods. The parish is made up of two worship sites through the Renew My Church process, and St. Barbara Church and St. Therese Chinese Catholic Church are now one parish. The parish includes a number of local groups like the Cantonese Group, SMI Club, St. Rocco Society, Mandarin Group and Indonesian Group. Catering to a variety of regions and ethnic affiliations, the parish offers Mass in English, Cantonese, Mandarin and Indonesian and is a true demonstration of diversity in the Catholic faith right here in Chicago.

In 2017, St. Therese Chinese Catholic Church was featured in the campaign newsletter, which noted that the parish had exceeded its *To Teach Who Christ Is* campaign goal by 151 percent. The parish used funds raised to upgrade its parish website with design and bilingual capabilities,

and develop a formation series titled Catholicism 101, which was held for parishioners to brush up on catechesis and address what it means to be a Catholic.

"Since we last connected in 2017, we have been able to offer Catholicism 201 (focusing on missionary discipleship) and Catholicism 301 (focusing on Chinese martyrs)," said Fr. Li, priest at St. Mother Teresa of Calcutta. "Both 201 and 301 were well-attended and received. In addition, we have enhanced our faith formation with regular retreats and pilgrimages. Parishioners and friends have benefited so much from these spiritual opportunities."

With the offered faith formation series and resources, parishioners have been equipped and empowered to serve and evangelize. Corporal works of mercy, such as regularly serving in food pantry and evangelization, have increased, and more people in the community have come to believe in Jesus each year. Fr. Li noted that at this year's Easter Vigil, the parish joyfully welcomed eight new people into the Catholic Church.

"The mission of the parish entrusted by Jesus Christ is ongoing," said Fr. Li. "With Renew My Church, our unified parish has so much to be grateful for. We have a wonderful mission to carry on."

Fr. Li and the rest of the parish are aware of many more people in the community who are in need of hearing the Good News of Jesus Christ. The parish plans to continue to find new and creative ways to reach out and be of service to their community.
